



Academic Scholarship

The awarding of a scholarship identifies those pupils who will be academic leaders in their year group. Recipients will demonstrate a high level of intellectual curiosity and a genuine passion for learning. The number and size of scholarships is at the discretion of the Head Master.

Pupils applying for a scholarship will take Worth's own assessment tests and/or papers (Year 7 & Year 12) or the ISEB Common Academic Scholarship Exams (Year 9). All assessments will also include an interview. Reports from the pupil's current school will also be reviewed together with their personal statement which is required as part of the application form.

The conferral of a scholarship carries with it responsibility. Scholars are expected to set an example for the other pupils in their conduct and approach to academic study, and to participate in or lead academic clubs and societies. Scholarships awarded at Year 7 (11+) and Year 9 (13+) would be expected to continue throughout an award holder's time at Worth but scholars are reviewed annually to assess the quality of their work and contributions against the expectations of Scholars. Failure to fulfil these expectations is likely to lead to the scholarship being withdrawn.
