



Art Scholarship

Candidates applying for Year 12:

Students will be required to discuss an edited portfolio of their best work with the Head of Department. Ideally this selection of work and workbooks should display proficiency in a broad range of media and a variety of approaches to making Art. Students should also bring their current workbooks to this interview. Interviews can be arranged prior to the Scholarship Day. This would be preferable as the candidates need to be seen individually – please contact the Head of Art directly to arrange this.

Candidates applying for Years 7 & 9:

Pupils hoping to win an award should be able to communicate their enthusiasm for the subject (both visually and verbally), and skill in using a broad range of media. On the day, there will be a brief practical art challenge and students will also be required to bring a portfolio of their best work to date.

Guidelines for the portfolio:

- We are interested in seeing strong work in a range of media.
- There must be some strong observational drawing in the folder of work.
- Any ceramic or 3D pieces need to be photographed from several viewpoints and included in the portfolio. Please do not bring actual 3D artworks.
- We will also be looking for one or two more involved pieces, which have taken several hours, to display skill, refinement, creativity, innovation and imagination....and also perhaps an understanding of Art History.
- Quality and not quantity is the key to an impressive portfolio.
